Catholic Charities residences for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities help individuals achieve their highest level of functioning and to participate as fully as possible in the surrounding community.

When Brian was three years old, he had a massive cerebral hemorrhage and needed extensive care. As he got older his parents wanted to find a place where he could be more independent and be part of a community. Just before his thirtieth birthday, Brian moved into Catholic Charities’ Christopher Residence.

“This program means so much to Brian and our family. It gives him so much pleasure living here and it gives our family joy to see how happy he is. He’s content and safe and as we are getting older we know that he will continue to be cared for with love and dignity,” shared Mrs. Healy, Brian’s mom.

Mr. Healy wanted us to know that recently when they were all out to dinner, Brian gleamed, *“God loves me just the way I am!”* Indeed he does, and after meeting Brian – we all do!

Part of the comprehensive Social Ministry Program at St. Raphael in East Meadow is the Hope Mobile. It schedules rides for seniors and homebound parishioners and brings them to Mass, food shopping and to medical appointments.

“The Hope Mobile was originally purchased several years ago by the Parish Share of the Catholic Ministries Appeal. We were able to buy the van and retrofit it to accommodate wheelchair users. On Long Island there aren’t satisfactory transportation options for the growing population of seniors. Many that we serve can’t wait outside for long periods of time for those services that are available.”

One senior shared, *“I am able to attend Mass which gives me the opportunity to receive communion, contribute to my parish and be part of a community. At home I don’t have anyone to talk to – this is a way for me to mingle with others.”*

Fr. Roger Velasquez grew up in El Salvador right next to a Church that his family took care of. *“I remember playing and praying there. That’s how I was first introduced to the life of the Church.”* The priest only came once a year for the feast of St. John the Baptist – and the town would have a huge celebration. *“It was a very joyful event*

and I remember looking to the priest as a role model and I would dream - I could be that one day.”

Fr. Velasquez’s family prayed together, said the rosary together and his mom was his catechist. *“It was at home that I learned the values I carry with me today.”*

“My goal is to be an instrument of God’s presence to the People of God on Long Island. All of us are called to holiness and we do that when we evangelize others - to take what God has given us to others.”

Ways to Give

Gifts of Cash – Checks should be made payable to the “Catholic Ministries Appeal,” and you can pledge your gift over ten months.

Credit Card – We accept American Express, Discover, Mastercard and Visa. Simply provide your credit card information on your pledge card/envelope or give online at www.drvc.org/CMA.

Matching Gifts – Go to www.matchinggifts.com/drvc to see if your employer will match the charitable contributions of employees.

IRA Charitable Rollover – If you are at least 70½ years old on the date you make your gift and your IRA is a traditional or Roth, you can transfer up to \$100,000 per year from your IRA to charity – without incurring income taxes today or estate tax in the future.

Gift of Securities – Federal tax laws allow a charitable deduction for the full market value of securities on the date of your gift.

Donor Advised Funds – You can recommend a gift to the CMA through your Donor Advised Fund (DAF).

Established in 1986, the Council of Stewards is an honorary society that provides encouragement and advice to our Bishop through the submission of suggestions by direct correspondence or if inclined, by serving on an advisory committee. The Council also assists the Diocese in providing charitable, educational and pastoral care to the people of Long Island through sacrificial support at a minimum level of \$5,000.
