

**IRA Charitable Rollover** – If you are at least 70 1/2 years old on the date you make your gift and your IRA is a traditional or Roth, you can transfer up to \$100,000 per year

from your IRA to charity – without incurring income taxes today or estate tax in the future.

**Gift of Securities** – Appreciated securities is one way to make a significant contribution at a reduced cost to you. Federal tax laws allow a charitable deduction for the full market value of securities on the date of your gift.
