TODAY ON LONG ISLAND: THE HARSH REALITY

- Our regional poverty level has grown to 6.6 % the highest since 1959. (L.I. Newsday)
- Nearly 300,000 on Long Island suffer from hunger, including more than 100,000 children. (L.I. Newsday)
- The elderly make up 4 percent of Long Island's hungry. (Long Island Cares)
- Approximately 35% of Long Island households are considered ALICE (Asset Limited Income Restrained and Employed) and they regularly turn to community pantries, such as local parish outreach programs for emergency and ongoing food assistance. (United Way)
- Over 38% of Long Island households spend more than 35% of their income on housing. That's an 11% rise since 2000. (Long Island Federation of Labor)
- On Long Island there are more than 3,900 people living in shelters or on the street. (Dept. of Housing and Urban Development)
- Of Long Island's 2.8 million people, more than 300,000 struggle with alcoholism or other drug addictions. (Long Island Council on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence)
